Short annotation of the course	The academic discipline "The German Language" is an elective discipline for the specialty 223 Nursing of the Bachelor's Degree in the 3 rd semester (for group II MCi-22), and in the 4 th semester (for group II MCi-21). The program of the academic discipline is designed in such a way as to provide students of higher education with the necessary knowledge and skills to use the German language in everyday and professional communication. The subject of study of the academic discipline is vocabulary, grammar and phonetics of the German language.		
Purpose and goals of the course	The purpose of studying the academic discipline "The German Language" is the formation of student's abilities and skills to use German in everyday and professional communication in oral and written forms. According to the requirements of educational program, students should know: - Lexical material used in typical conversational situations; - Grammatical structures necessary for the formation of language and speech competence;		

- Lexical models corresponding to formal and informal styles of speech;
- Peculiarities of the phonetics of the German language, intonation and emphasis.

- Articulate German sounds;
- Make the correct verbal and logical emphasis;
- Form various types of sentence intonation;
- Practically use lexical units in different spheres of human activity in accordance with the course program;
- Read and analyze texts in original in order to obtain information;
- Make a monologue message;
- Conduct a conversation according to the topics of the course;
- Apply communication skills during a conversation;
- Theoretically and practically use grammar topics according to the course;
- Understand by ear the content of authentic texts, considering them as a source of information;
- Generalize, systematize and analyze information which was read.

Course policy

Current control includes oral answers to questions and/or written tasks according to control the current lexical and grammatical topic of the class. Written assignments may include tests and open-ended questions, grammar exercises, and translation exercises. In addition to the current control, a final modular control work is provided, which is carried out in a written form. The final mark is calculated as the arithmetic mean of the current control and the modular control. **Teaching methods** During the educational process the following forms and methods of teaching are used: practical classes, individual tasks, student's individual work, consultations, In case of distance learning mode, the learning environment MOODLE, or Google Classroom are used. Practical classes are conducted by means of ZOOM. Current communication between a teacher and students can also be performed by means of e-mails or Viber. **Necessary equipment** In normal training mode. Studying of the course involves joining each student to the learning environment MOODLE, or Google Classroom. In the distance learning mode during quarantine, the study of the course additionally involves joining each student to the programs ZOOM, or Meet (for classes in video conferencing).
